

Activity 1 – Were you listening carefully?

In this activity, pupils apply Steps 5 and 6 of Listening from the Skills Builder Framework. Listening Step 5: I can listen to extended talk and identify the key information I need. Listening Step 6: I can take part and respond in a group discussion.

Share the definition: "Listening is the receiving, retaining and processing of information or ideas". Using the Discover & Do worksheet, ask pupils to:

- ☐ Fill in the missing information in the sentences about Kiran
- ☐ Tell a partner what surprised them most about Kiran, her job and the skills she used

Activity 2 – Plan an activity

In this activity, pupils will work with a partner to plan a learning activity using a planning format.

Provide pupils with a learning outcome they have previously covered and explain to them that they have to plan an activity for another group to support, apply or challenge their learning. If more appropriate, they could plan an activity for a younger year group.

It might be advisable to give the class a learning objective and model an example plan for a learning activity.



Reflection Question: How do you think teachers work together when thy are planning your lessons?

Activity 3 – Social action project



Extended project

In this activity, pupils will design a social action project to make teachers happy.

Ask pupils to design a social action project to make teachers happy and brighten up their day! They might want to plan to leave notes for teachers to find, make something for them, make rewards or create motivational posters. Encourage them to bring their ideas back into class, you could have a class vote to decide on the best project – or a judging panel could decide.



Reflection Question: Why is it important that people are happy when they come to work?
